The Board began the meeting with Roger Baker, Engineer for the S. Water Treatment Plant, coming forward to open the bids for the project. He went through a checklist of documents included for all 5 bids submitted. Westfield Electric was not qualified to be opened. The five contractors were Regent Electric, Titan Mechanics Inc., Kirk Brothers, Peterson Construction, and RMF Nooter. Based on the bids opened, RMF Nooter was low bid for general contractor and Regent Electric for the electrical contractor. Roger will take the bids back to his office and verify all appropriate documentation and get back to the Board in the next week. Roger also provided the Board some pricing he researched on a new water tower and equipment needed as this will be a project in the future.

Roberta Acosta, from RCAP, then discussed the funding for the project. She provided a written funding scenario for the ODWA loan for the Board to review. After discussion, a 15 year loan was approved. She has until March 15, 2016 to get the loan approved at her next Board meeting. Roger will get the approved contractors to her in a week.

WATER

Nathan said work on Well #3 is still being done. They are still working to get the packing/liner out.

Nathan then discussed the hardness violation from the EPA. We have received a second violation. The EPA representative in Bowling Green now says they are correct but will have them reviewed in Columbus. He states the hardness levels were set when the N. Water Plant was given EPA approval on the project.

SEWER

The Board again discussed the Eastwood School project. A non- public meeting is scheduled March 3, 2016 at 6:30 in Council Chambers. Those invited are Dean Krukemyer, Landry Sheets, Steve Darmofal, Tom Stalter, an engineer from Poggemeier Design Group, and Brent Welker. They will attempt to finalize a recommendation to take back to the appropriate Boards and Council.
